Member Thomas attended the most recent Fresno Chamber of Commerce Educational Committee meeting. There were discussions on the success of the career fair. They would like to expand the fair next year. Ms. Thomas also commended FCOE employee Valerie Vuicich for doing an excellent job representing the County Office on the Committee.

Member Thomas reported that the CCBE leadership would like to have its own conference in October. Member Thomas asked if any County Board members would be interested in attending a CCBE conference in October 2006. None of the County Board members were interested.

Member Clyde granted permission for funds to be moved from his budget allowance to other board member's budgets as needed to cover ongoing expenses.

## MOVED TO: SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Mehas reported on the following:

- State Water Bonds Implications on the Central Valley & County Schools: If the legislature ignores the Valley on the issue of water it will critically impact school districts. Superintendent Mehas asked board members to take note of the sample resolution in their table packets regarding the water issue and mistreatment of Juan Arambula. Board members asked that the resolution be placed on June 2006 agenda.
- PACE Charter School Court Hearing Update: Senior Administrator Jan Biggs briefed the board on the outcome of the hearing.
- H.S. Exit Exam Court Ruling: Superintendent Mehas was disappointed with the ruling.
- Selma Learning Academy Charter: Deputy Superintendent Richard Martin briefed the board on location changes of the Charter since approved by the Board in 2005.
- State Art & Music Education Funds: Fresno County will not receive funding.
- Recruitment and Retention of Math Teachers: State Secretary of Education will designate which counties will receive funding.
- Governor Schwarzenegger's Education Commission: Superintendent Mehas was asked to serve as the State Wide Co-Chair of the Education Commission.
- Governor Schwarzenegger Requests FCOE's Help: Superintendent Mehas was asked by State Board of Education Member Bonnie Ruiz to review and give recommendations on legislation regarding supplemental materials for limited English speakers. Superintendent Mehas immediately delegated the request to Dr. Don Holder and Dr. Katherine Catania. Their ability to turn quality work around quickly proved FCOE's credibility and ability to influence state policy. Superintendent Mehas commended FCOE staff for their expertise and professionalism.
- 2006 Superintendent Election: Superintendent Mehas commended the Board and FCOE staff for remaining professional in this Superintendent election.
- Goodwill Committee FCOE Picnic will be held at Scout Island June 10<sup>th</sup>. The Superintendent
  and the Board agreed to invite certain non-FCOE individuals who helped in the Wagon Train
  and present them with certificates thanking them for their contributions to the Wagon Train
  Sesquicentennial Event.
- Sesquicentennial Celebration Projects & Events: FCOE is compiling a Sesquicentennial book which will include several pages on the history of FCOE. We will also enter a float for the September 30<sup>th</sup> Sesquicentennial Parade. In addition, we will be involved in the

Sesquicentennial kick off at the 2006 Fresno Fair.
