MINUTES May 15, 2008

CALL TO ORDER

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH

REPORT Health Services "Enhancing Lives" Barbara Miller introduced members of her nursing staff and shared a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Enhancing Lives" as a tribute to school nurses and the special students population they serve.

Washington Union High School – Health Institute Marti Hipp, Program Coordinator for Washington Union High School's Health Institute, shared that the Health Institute Program was formulated in 2004 to meet the needs of students interested in pursuing a career in the health field. Students selected for the institute receive intensive training and complete a rigorous curriculum to prepare for post secondary qualification into a four year university. The district's 15 graduating students have all been accepted into four-year universities; some with more than one acceptance. Students Isabel Aquino and Jeff Wells were in attendance and shared their appreciation for the opportunity to attend the program. Isabel was accepted to UCLA and Jeff has elected to attend the UC/CSU Medical Program at CSU-Fresno.

Court Schools – NASA Project

Dan Loewen and his NASA Project students shared some very exciting projects they have been involved in this year. In November, 2007 a student project was accepted by NASA to fly a student designed project on NASA's C-9B reduced gravity aircraft in Houston, Texas. A flight team of four JJC instructors left for Houston in early March for training and to conduct research. In February, 2008, Mr. Loewen presented a human vestibular system in microgravity and some of the latest Mars research being done in the Mojave Desert at NASA's Space Explorers Educators Conference in Houston, Texas. Last March, several teachers from Court and Community Schools went to NASA Ames Research Center on a one day field trip.

Scout Island Field Trip

Seven students from the Fresno County Juvenile Justice Campus participated in a field trip to Scout Island in February. This endeavor was a joint effort between the Fresno County Office of Education Court Schools and the Juvenile Probation Department. The field trip provided students with a unique opportunity to study biology, geology and to view nature in a quiet and serene setting.

Curriculum & Instruction Williams/Valenzuela Uniform Complaints Quarterly Report Dr. Catania shared an overview of the Valenzuela Lawsuit Settlement Agreement. As part of the Williams Lawsuit Compliance Settlement Agreement, all districts are mandated to report to their Board of Trustees, on a quarterly basis, summarized data on any complaints received and the nature of the resolution of all complaints. Dr. Catania reported that there were no complaints received from January 1, 2008 through March 31, 2008.
